The point of Thanksgiving is to remember the things we have to be grateful for. It's our special time to give thanks... not just for the obvious, like food, but for the thousands of fortunate moments, the multitude of blessings that we receive each year.

That's not always as easy as it sounds. We tend to remember the bad things much more easily than the good. That's where this article comes in. Using the tips below you can make thankfulness an everyday habit. It's a skill that will benefit you throughout the year.

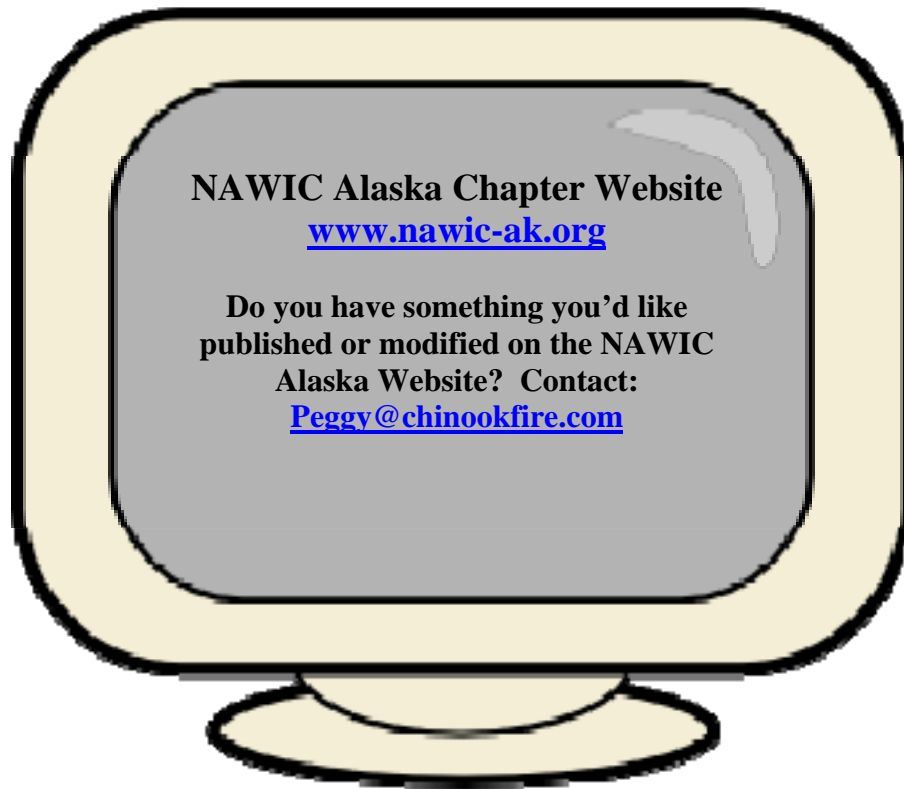

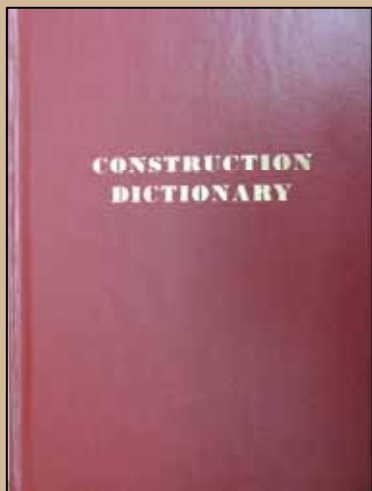

Reptiles

- Evacuate using a pillowcase, but transfer it to a permanent, secure place as soon as possible
- Take a sturdy bowl for your pet to soak in and a warming devices such as a hot water bottle

Small animals & rodents

- Transport in secure carriers with adequate bedding materials and food
- Keep a salt lick and week's worth of bedding in the emergency kit

If you cannot evacuate

If pets are left alone as an absolute last resort, it is suggested to confine them to the hosue, preferably to a single room with few or now windows. Leave out plenty of food and water – less palatable food is best, as it will make the animals less inclined to overeat.

In emergency situations, it is more important than ever that your pet has proper identification that lists your name, address and phone number, as well as contact information for your veterinarian. Be certain also that the animal's rabies & license tags are worn.

Reuniting with your animal

One of the most effective ways to ensure you are reunited with your pet in the event of separation during a natural disaster is to have the pet microchipped. Although the microchip cannot track the location of your animal if he or she becomes lost, rescuers can use a scanner on lost animals to read the microchip and access the pet's owner and contact information.




